

National Film Board (NFB) enriches education with a vast collection of documentaries and animations, offering engaging, real-world content for diverse learning experiences. Interactive features such as Media School guide students through the steps of exploring and creating.

EFFECTIVE SEARCHING

Over **6000 Canadian films** are available online for free viewing. These include documentaries, animated films, and interactive media.

Search the entire collection in **English and in French** and locate films deemed appropriate for **students aged 5 to 18+**.

CURATED CONTENT

Educational Playlists and Learning Channels highlight important themes and voices, including Indigenous cinema.

Content is also organized into **eighteen School Subjects**, such as Languages, Mathematics, Technology Education, Civics/Citizenship, and Health/Personal Development.

INTERACTIVE FEATURES

Media School (ages 13-18) includes activities related to the stages of film production.

Ocean School (ages 11-15) is an interdisciplinary environmental resource that uses inquiry-based learning and problem solving to increase ocean literacy and STEM skills.

EDUCATOR TOOLS

Many of the films include **Study Guides** written by Canadian educators, such as "Exploring Literary Devices and Terms through NFB Animated Films".

Mini-lessons and **professional development** recordings also support teaching and learning of National Film Board content.
